GRADING

This is an open competition, run under training conditions, so NZ Competitors will not gain ESNZ points for any placings in Dressage and Show Jumping, This is not a HOYQ competition.

Riders may enter what classes they wish pursuant to rules of entry (see below).

This event will be run to Equestrian Sport New Zealand Rules for Eventing (Combined Training), Dressage and Jumping.

Service / Agency Attire: This will be judged by a mystery judge over two days.

Competitors are strongly encouraged to enter into the spirit of the Australasian Police and Emergency Services Games by improvisation of their service / agency identity through their riding and horse's attire.

Agency patches, uniforms and colour co-ordination greatly add to the spectacle and the uniqueness of this competition.

The "Smartest on Parade" event judge will be influenced by quality, originality and the innovation of agency entrants in these events.

RULES

All events will be run pursuant to ESNZ Rules for Discipline.

- Combined Training will be run under ESNZ Eventing Rules.
- Dressage: Horses can only be entered in two different levels.
- Pre Caprilli: Horses can only be entered in one class.
- Combined Training: Horses can only be entered in one Combined Training Class.
- Show Horse: Horse / Riders can enter any classes pursuant to class restrictions.
- Jumping: Horses can only be entered in two heights, and the 6 Bar. (There are two rounds at each height, one in ring 1 and one in ring 2, entry includes both)

The organising committee reserves the right to change the program prior to the event.

GENERAL INFORMATION

It is compulsory for all entrants in this event and their supporters to read this notice and comply with its stipulations. They are also re-sponsible for familiarising themselves with the event venue and all its hazards. Please inform your supporters of their responsibility to comply. Signing your waiver or completing your online entry is an indication you agree to comply with these guidelines.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITY

- You are responsible for your own health and safety during the event.
- The Equestrian Events involve an element of risk, where competitors may encounter challenging conditions.
- You should only undertake to participate in this event if you believe that you are fit to do so.
- At no stage during this event should you engage in activity that would threaten your own safety and the safety of other people.
- You should obey marshal and Event Staff where they are instructing you for your safety.
- Marshals are giving up their time to help you, please treat them with respect. If you have any issues with a marshal's conduct please do not approach them independently please refer to the Event Manager.
- Whilst every effort is made to make sure the venue is marked accurately, and marshals are available at key points it is your responsibility to know the venue prior to starting your event.

VENUE AND CONDITIONS

- Conditions on the event days are undetermined and can change during an event, please observe and act accordingly for your safety.
- The venue is naturally uneven / off road please remain aware at all times of potential risk to self and others.

For International or long-distance travellers expecting to arrive prior to the first day of competition, please contact the Equestrian Co-ordinator who will assist with access to the A & P Showgrounds where overnight yards are available.

Loan Horses: For remote long-distance and International competitors, please contact the Equestrian Co-ordinator who will assist with contact details of individuals and organisations where they may be able to arrange the hire of a horse for competition.

Long-distance / International competitors will be responsible for dealing directly with horse owners and negotiating the reimbursements (payments) and insurance cover (where required). Competitors will be responsible for the feeding and maintenance costs and payments. A list of loan horses for long-distance / International competitors has commenced. If anyone wishes to compete on a loan horse they are to contact Equestrian Co-ordinator Kayte Korach at kate.korach@police.govt.nz or on (+64) 021 191 9623. The Equestrian Co-ordinator and Event Management Committee will provide information only and have no further involvement in negotiations or payments to any horse providers.

Venue Facilities:

- All helmets must have a red tag.

- Yards \$10.00 per day per pen.
- Stallion Pen \$20.00 per day per pen.

Article 238.2.2 AM5 (A Jump off class against the clock) The first round is timed, however if there are competitors tied for first place after the first round (with equal jump faults) a jump-off will be carried out. The jump-off is also timed. The winner will be the competitor with the least faults and the fastest time in the jump-off. Those who jumped off fill 5 the top placings based on faults and time in the jump-off. The rest of the placings are filled by the competitors who had the next least jump faults, and based on their time in the first round. Instant jump off.
